For decades, Ornelas and Pete have traveled the country and the world as ambassadors of Navajo culture and teachers of tapestry weaving. *Spider Woman's Children: Navajo Weavers Today* is a richly illustrated and deeply personal book by the sisters, which introduces us to individual weavers and their families.
